Besides Snow and Hayes, the four-hour meeting also will include Don Glaser of USBR, Don Koch of the state Department of Fish and Game, Ren Lohofener of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Russ Strach of the National Marine Fisheries Service, and Phil Isenberg of the Delta Vision Blue Ribbon Task Force. The session will be held at the Capitol Plaza Holiday Inn, 300 J St., Sacramento.
