DWR posts latest California Drought Update

The latest monthly California Drought Update has been posted to DWR's drought webpage. It reports: Cold Pacific storms in April significantly improved water supply outlook conditions with precipitation and snowpack conditions statewide well above average. The forecast for spring runoff from April through July is expected to be well above average at 115 percent statewide. Below average water supply conditions still persist in the Klamath and Lake Tahoe basins. [Read more](#).

Federal EPA seeks facilitator for tribal climate change program

The federal EPA needs a facilitator to communicate and put in motion tribal climate change adaptation planning to respond to the effects of climate change.
