### **Series of workshops set to help with urban water management plans**

DWR is inviting urban water suppliers to attend one of the upcoming workshops on 2010 Urban Water Management Plans. These workshops will include information on developing water use baselines and targets, a new data online submittal tool, and the final Guidebook for 2010 Urban Water Management Plans.
