Federal agencies team up to form water resources partnership

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and U.S. Geological Survey have signed a [memorandum of understanding](#) forming a partnership of federal agencies to address America's growing water resources challenges. The partnership will allow the participating agencies to coordinate and cooperate in activities to improve water resource services and build a Federal Support Toolbox for Integrated Water Resources Management.
