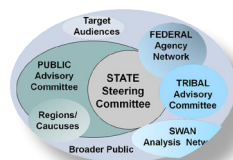

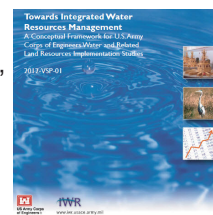


Workshops on guidelines for flood plan funding to be held next month

The workshops will be Wednesday, Aug. 8, in [Stockton](#), and Thursday, Aug. 9, in [Sacramento](#). The guidelines will be used to determine funding for local agencies.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers taking a close look at the benefits of IWM
