Recap of integrated water management summit made available in new report

The proceedings from California's first integrated water management (IWM) summit are available in a new report, [A Commitment to Action](#). The summit was held earlier this year and included the launch of the Water 360 campaign which is designed to use IWM to strengthen the efforts of California's water management community. The summit was held in Sacramento on April 3.



Upcoming Water Plan regional forums will cover North Coast and South Coast

Two regional forums for *California Water Plan Update 2013* will be held during the next week. The [North Coast Regional Forum](#) will be held tomorrow, Sept. 26. It will be available as a webinar with satellite locations in Eureka, Santa Rosa and Eureka. On Monday, Sept. 30, the [South Coast Regional Forum](#) will be held under a similar format with a satellite location in Riverside.

\$92 million in stormwater flood management grants awarded to 10 agencies

DWR has posted the list of [final awards](#) for Proposition 1E Round 2 Stormwater Flood Management (SWFM) Grants. The list includes 10 agencies that will receive a total of more than \$92 million. This was the second and final round of [SWFM grant](#) solicitation under Proposition 1E.

Flood emergency response grants awarded to 14 local agencies

Fourteen agencies will be receiving a total of \$5 million in Statewide Flood Emergency Response Projects Grants. The funding will go toward improving local flood emergency response and increase public safety. Fish and Wildlife sets meetings to get public input on SWAP

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has scheduled 11 meetings throughout the state to get public input on updating the [State Wildlife Action Plan](#) (SWAP). The first meeting is Thursday, October 3, in West Sacramento. The rest of the schedule is [here](#). The SWAP examines the health of fish and wildlife populations and looks for ways to conserve species and habitats before they become rare and more costly to protect.
