DWR posts audio recordings from listening session on water use efficiency order

Audio recordings [have been posted](#) from one of this month's listening sessions on Governor Brown's water use efficiency [executive order](#). The sessions were designed to explain how the elements of the executive order will be implemented. The two recordings are the urban webinar and the agricultural webinar that were part of the [June 3 session](#) in Sacramento.

Guidelines released for \$10 million in water use efficiency project loans

The final [guidelines and proposal solicitation package](#) have been posted for the [CalConserve Revolving Fund Loan Program](#). The program will make \$10 million in Proposition 1 funds available as loans to local agencies for water conservation and water use efficiency projects. A public workshop to provide information on the application process will be held July 15, in Sacramento. A [webcast](#) will be available. The application deadline is August 31.



DWR releases updated schedule for 2016 Water-Energy Grant Program draft documents

DWR has [updated the schedule](#) for the 2016 Water-Energy Grant Program. [Draft versions](#) of the California Air Resources Board's greenhouse gas quantification methodology, and the greenhouse gas emission calculator, will be released in July.

Contracts awarded to provide technical assistance to urban water agencies

Under a contract awarded by the [American Water Works Association](#) (AWWA), California urban water systems will be able to get technical assistance on water loss issues. The AWWA has contracted [Water Systems Optimization](#), and [Cavanaugh & Associates](#) to provide training and assistance to water agencies. The \$3.2 million program will run approximately two years.

New CVFPB website offers easier navigation and information access

The Central Valley Flood Protection Board (CVFPB) has taken the wraps off a [new website](#). It offers easier navigation, including prominent "Webcast" and "Calendar" buttons that provide access to the latest information on board meetings.
