Water agencies participating in California's Native American Day celebration

DWR and the State Water Resources Control Board will be participating in the 49th annual [Native American Day](#) celebration at the State Capitol. Both will have booths set up as part of the event, this Friday, Sept. 23. The day will include cultural presentations and focus on education in Native American communities.



Advisory group will discuss ways to quantify efficiency of agricultural water use

The [agricultural advisory group](#) for Governor Brown's water conservation [executive order](#) will be meeting Monday, Sept. 26, in Madera. The group will be discussing methodologies for quantifying efficiency in agricultural water use. Some of the same ideas were presented in a [2012 report to the Legislature](#).

Strategic Growth Council provides a vision for linking land use to climate policy

The Strategic Growth Council has [issued a report](#) providing a vision of land management practices for California through 2050. The report looks at land use in the context of California's climate change policy. It discusses how the State government can support actions that help achieve climate and resource conservation goals.

The effects of fire will be discussed at watershed forum tomorrow in Chico

A [forum](#) on the history of fire in the Sacramento River Watershed will be held tomorrow, Sept. 22, in Chico. [The discussion](#) will include efforts to safeguard communities and the environment against catastrophic fires. The forum is part of the observance of Sierra Nevada Watershed Protection Week.

Work begins on tidal restoration project for the Suisun Marsh

Work started this week on a [tidal restoration project](#) in the Suisun Marsh that will return salty tides to several hundred acres in Solano County. The [Tule Red project](#) will create habitat and increase food production for native fish including Chinook salmon and Delta smelt. The project is expected to be completed in 2019.



Two-day DSC meeting will include single-year water transfers public hearing

The Delta Stewardship Council's (DSC's) [next meeting](#) will be a two-day session, Sept. 29 and 30, in Sacramento. The council will conduct a public hearing to consider amendments to the Delta Plan regarding [single-year water transfers](#). There will also be an update on an amendment for [conveyance, storage, and operations](#).

CCST marks 28 years of promoting science and technology in California

The California Council on Science & Technology (CCST) is marking its [28th anniversary](#) this month. It was established to identify long-range research needs for economic development, and provide direction for scientific and technological activities. The CCST developed a [water technology roadmap](#) report that was used for the [California Water Plan Update 2013](#) objective on [water technology and science](#).
