




WETCAT AB32 Scoping Plan 2013 Update

- AB32 mandates that the Scoping Plan be updated every five years
- The four WETCAT lead agencies, DWR, CEC, CPUC, and SWRCB, are collaborating on the 2013 Scoping Plan Update
- The 2013 Scoping Plan contains five resource sector sections: Water, Energy, Waste, Agriculture, and Transportation/Land Use/Fuels

Differences between the 2008 Scoping Plan and the 2013 Scoping Plan

- 2008 Plan set numeric 2020 goals
- 2013 Plan creates a qualitative vision for 2035 and 2050 (AB32 does not set post-2020 numeric GHG reduction targets)
- 2013 Plan focuses on overcoming hurdles to achieving additional GHG reductions



2008 Scoping Plan

- Six Water Measures from the 2008 AB32 Scoping Plan

1. Water Conservation
2. Recycled Water
3. Water System Efficiency
4. Stormwater Capture
5. Renewables
6. Public Goods Charge

Mixed Results

- 20x2020 legislation
- Water agency leadership actions
- Incomplete data
- Challenging funding environment




2013 Scoping Plan Timeline and Other Relevant 2013 State Climate Planning Efforts

- WETCAT draft to California Air Resources Board (CARB) in late May
- CARB public workshops in the Summer
- Scoping Plan adopted in November or December
- California Readiness (Adaptation) Strategy
- Statewide Research Plan
- Governor's Environmental Goals and Policy Report



2013 Scoping Plan Water Priority Areas

- State policies that require and incent regional and integrated supply and demand management based on enforceable targets and standards
- State policies that mandate and incent water utilities to meet more rigorous water conservation targets while maintaining financial viability
- State policies that improve assessment and management of groundwater to support mitigation, adaptation, and water quality goals
- State policies that improve water and energy use data collection and dissemination among state agencies and to the public
