

CALIFORNIA WATER PLAN UPDATE 2009 SOUTH LAHONTAN REGIONAL WORKSHOP ANNOUNCEMENT



The Department of Water Resources, in cooperation with 20 other State agencies, invites you to participate in a series of regional public workshop to gather and share information about the Public Review Draft of the California Water Plan (CWP) Update 2009. The CWP is California's strategic plan for water and covers topics such as water uses, water supply, water quality, regional conditions, regional water planning and flood management, and options for improving water management.

The South Lahontan regional workshop will be held in **Bishop** on **Friday, April 24, 2009** from 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The workshop will be held at the Inyo-Mono Title Company at **873 North Main Street, Bishop**, CA 93514 (Boardwalk Conference Room). Representatives of: water agencies and associations; local, state, and federal governments; California Native American Tribes; watershed and community groups; conservancies; and the public are strongly encouraged to attend.

This workshop is part of the public outreach to discuss water issues and management strategies in the San Francisco Bay hydrologic region for inclusion in the Water Plan's regional reports. The workshops will highlight the Public Review Draft for Update 2009, along with the Regional Report for the area, and other Statewide water-related initiatives. At the workshops, specific input will be sought regarding:

- public comment on the Public Review Draft of Update 2009
- local and regional activities, issues, and water management strategies
