Chapter 0. Sediment Management

Sediment Management in California

This section defines what Sediment Management and provides an overview of the topic. We will particularly want to emphasize the nexus of sediment management with overall integrated water management for supply, flood and quality.

FOR DISCUSSION - Right now we see this chapter considering several things:

- I. Sediment management to prevent inappropriate transport into waterways. This section will address land management practices.
- II. Water Management to support better soils management – this section would address irrigation and other water management practices that affect soils.
- III. In stream sediment management – includes water quality as well as navigation/dredging. This section would also consider issues related to dredging and contaminated spoils
- IV. Sediment management to support coastal beach replenishment, natural flood barriers and fisheries
