Subject: Question on landscape permits

To Whom It May Concern:

I feel there is some ambiguity about what a "landscape permit" is, when specifying what projects this ordinance will apply to (p. 5, line 6). In Fullerton, the only possible permits that could fall under this title for residential landscape work are those for grading (50 cy and over, for which I actually need a Civil Engineer to do a plan), and for irrigation, which I have never had an inspector ask for, even when we are having an inspector come on site for many different permits.

So, my question is: Exactly what type of "landscape permit" are you referring to? I am a sole proprietor (licensed L.A.) and do primarily residential renovations and new landscape plans of smaller to medium size lots (8,000 to one acre lots) so I would like to know specifically how this affects my practice. I am wholly supportive of the new ETAF rate as I promote waterwise plantings in my practice.
