Water Plan's Plenary session set for mid-October

The California Water Plan's Update 2009 Plenary Meeting will be held Oct. 14 and 15 at the Radison Hotel in Sacramento. The meeting had been scheduled for mid-September and was changed to October because of the Friday furloughs. The Plenary will bring together all participants of Update 2009 – the Advisory Committee, Steering Committee, regional stakeholders, the Statewide Water Analysis Network, and members of the public. Agenda posted for Water Plan advisory meeting on Aug. 13


