The next meeting of the Tribal Advisory Committee for California Water Plan Update 2013 is set for Thursday, May 5, in Humboldt County. SWAN workshop offers chance to test Water Plan tool

DWR and the Statewide Water Analysis Network (SWAN) will hold a workshop on Friday, May 13, for a hands-on test of an analytical tool and collaborative approach called Shared Vision Planning. The [Association of California Water Agencies](#) has unveiled a new policy framework that calls on local water agencies to implement plans and strategies to meet groundwater sustainability objectives.
