### EPA finds California water infrastructure needs \$44.5 billion through 2030

A nationwide survey found California is going to need \$44.5 billion through 2030 for the infrastructure to provide safe drinking water. The results are in a [report](#) published by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). It found the infrastructure across the country will require \$384 billion over the next 17 years.



### Water commission to discuss public benefits of water storage projects

This month's meeting of the [California Water Commission](#) will be Wednesday, June 19, in Sacramento. It will include a discussion of issues related to guidelines for [funding public benefits](#) of water storage projects. A [webcast](#) will be available.

### ARB looking for public input on California's emission reduction plan

The California Air Resources Board (ARB) will hold a [public meeting](#) tomorrow, June 13, in Sacramento, to discuss a scoping plan for reducing greenhouse gas emissions in the state. The [California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006](#) requires the ARB to develop a plan that will reduce the emissions to 1990 levels by 2020. The plan is updated regularly to ensure California is on track to achieve the reduction goal.
